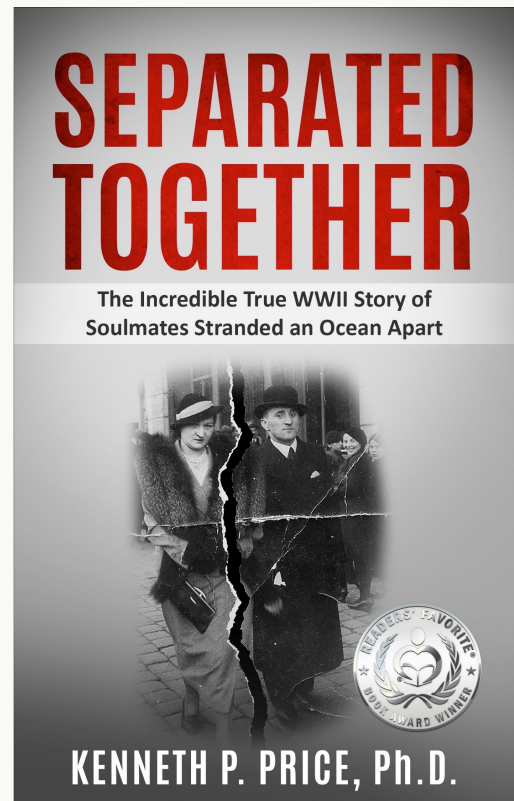
Seven weeks

Synopsis

Abe and Sonia Huberman were building a family in Warsaw when Abe left for America in the summer of 1939. He expected to return after a brief visit. The outbreak of war made the journey home impossible.

Sonia's account moves through the Warsaw ghetto, deportation, the murder of her children, and imprisonment in Nazi concentration camps. Her sister and other women appear as vital presences in her story. Abe, stranded in America, faced uncertainty about his family while learning a language and finding work.

After the war, a search notice helped reconnect them. Sonia arrived in America in 1946. The book follows their reunion into decades of family life: raising children, remembering those who were murdered, and making a new home.

What distinguishes this account

Kenneth writes as the couple's son-in-law. His family knowledge and psychological perspective give particular attention to life after the reunion, and to the ways later generations receive and preserve memory.

The person behind the family history.

Kenneth P. Price, Ph.D., is a psychologist and the author of *Separated Together*. He is married to Gloria, the daughter of Abe and Sonia Huberman. His account draws on family memories, interviews, letters, and archival research, bringing a son-in-law's perspective to a history that continued long after the war.

Professional background

Kenneth studied psychology at Brandeis University and earned his doctorate at SUNY Stony Brook. He worked in clinical and forensic psychology and taught at the University of Texas Southwestern Medical School.

Why he wrote the book

Gloria's talks about her parents regularly brought requests for a book. Kenneth gathered family memories, written recollections, letters, interviews, and documentary research to preserve their history for readers outside the family.
