

A brief journey. A seven-year separation.

Kenneth P. Price preserves the wartime and postwar story of Abe and Sonia Huberman in *Separated Together*.

In the summer of 1939, Abe Huberman left Poland for America, expecting a short visit. When war broke out, he could not return to his wife Sonia and their children in Warsaw. Their separation lasted nearly seven years.

Separated Together follows Sonia's survival of the Holocaust, Abe's life in America, their reunion in 1946, and the family they rebuilt. The account extends beyond wartime events to the relationships, memories, and acts of care that shaped the years afterward.

Author Kenneth P. Price, Ph.D., is Abe and Sonia's son-in-law. A psychologist, he draws on family memories, interviews, letters, and archival research. The book offers interview themes for history, literary, community, and family-story audiences.

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
